

ARTISTIC DIRECTOR'S INTRODUCTION



Welcome to the 70th Cork International Choral Festival. We are delighted to have so many choirs visiting us once again from all over the world, making this a truly international event.

The opening concert on Wednesday evening features one giant work of the choral repertoire, Edward Elgar's The Dream of Gerontius. The large forces that are required for this work mean that it is not often performed in Ireland. Our thanks to the Cork Fleischmann Symphony Orchestra, the East Cork Choral Society and the Guinness Choir who are performing this work, conducted by Keith Pascoe. We are delighted to welcome the Guinness Choir to this year's festival as they approach their 75th anniversary year. Roddy O'Keeffe celebrates this with his seminar about the choir on the afternoon of the concert. Their founder,

Victor Leeson, is remembered each year in Cork as in 2001, as part of their 50th Anniversary celebrations, the choir introduced the inaugural Victor Leeson Perpetual Trophy for Ireland's Choir of the Year.

Thursday will feature the a capella group Syng Selected, 31 of Denmark's the most talented young singers. Chamber Choir Ireland are conducted by Gabriel Crouch this year and their programme will include the winning entry of the Seán Ó Riada composition competition which is supported with our thanks by the Ó Riada family. Both this concert and the late night concert are held in St. Fin Barre's Cathedral and we are delighted that Cappella Pratensis from The Netherlands are presenting their programme Josquin in Rome for us. The Fleischmann Trophy Competition will be held on Saturday afternoon and again in the evening, and there is a second opportunity to hear these choirs perform in our closing Gala Concert on Sunday evening.

Even before the opening day of the festival, a choral conducting course will have already begun led by experts Anna Fűri from Hungary and Shane Lynch from the USA. The culmination of this course can be seen on Friday morning at an open session with Chamber Choir Ireland where the conductors will be put through their paces.

We are grateful to the many supporting bodies including Fáilte Ireland, the Arts Council, Cork City Council, and Cork County Council who provide much needed financial grant aid. Thanks also to lbec for their continuing support of our Workplace Choir of the Year Competition. Our appreciation also goes to our many other sponsors who contribute to making the Festival such a success.

My personal thanks also go to Elaine Fitzgerald (Festival Manager) and Michela Del Tin and Siobhan Brady (Festival Administrators) who work so hard throughout the year to ensure that everything we present is done to the highest standards.

I hope that you will enjoy the festival experience in Cork this year and you are all most welcome!

FESTIVAL PRESIDENT'S INTRODUCTION



Beirim fíor chaoin fáilte romhaibh go léir ag an 70ú Cór Fhéile Idirnáisiúnta Chorcaí 2025... a heartfelt welcome to you all to this year's festival when choirs from home and abroad, audiences, friends, festival organisers, will enrich our city and county both musically and financially. The heart of the Festival has always been its capacity as a major international festival, not just to present an excellent and wide-ranging programme, but, most importantly, to provide for its participants and audiences the positive opportunity to meet and share mutual understanding and friendship through choral music.

It is hard to believe that the festival celebrates its 70th edition this year. Those of you with mathematical minds will have ascertained that this year should be our 72nd festival but, through no fault of our

dedicated festival organisers, only two major events prevented it from taking place... the national emergency of Foot and Mouth Disease in 2001 when all public events were banned by the Government, and the international pandemic of Covid-19 in 2020 which brought the world to a stop. We continue to be the only festival, commenced under the initiative of An Tóstal in 1954, to remain in existence. We have not just continued, but have grown in scale, diversity, inclusivity, and quality, particularly in our outreach, to many venues in Cork city and county. We now annually attract large numbers of international attendees and have grown in international importance over the intervening years. More importantly, we have become a part of the city's artistic, musical, and social metabolism, an significant occasion for both participants from home and abroad, and for our large audiences to savour choral music and singing in all its facets in a manner which impacts on Cork and its inhabitants in a most positive way. The festival impacts on the city and county in a way that no other festival in the city can lay claim to. While I cannot personally lay claim to have been a part of the festival since its inception, the festival has been an active part of my life since 1969. A 56 year involvement as singer, conductor, member of artistic boards, executive boards, and initiator of many developments over the years as Artistic and Festival Director. Now, as Festival President, I continue to be proud of the festival and all of its achievements.

I take this opportunity as President of the Festival firstly, to thank all of our Grant Aid providers, sponsors and advertisers, our venues for their support, and the many people for the benefit in kind that we receive. Cork International Choral Festival is a jewel to be treasured and needs this continued support into the future. Secondly, I wish to acknowledge the great work undertaken by our administrative team, so ably led by Elaine FitzGerald, Festival Manager, Gerard Breen, Festival Chairman, Peter Stobart, Artistic Director, and the members of the Festival's Board of Directors for ensuring that Cork continues to present a quality festival of which of which we are very proud. Finally, I wish to publicly acknowledge our dedicated team of volunteers without whom we would find it much more difficult to function. My congratulations and thanks to everyone in this, our 70th festival, and I look forward to the opportunity of hearing much beautiful music and to meeting many friends over the next few days.

Cardinal John Henry Newman's poem tells of the journey of a man's soul after death. Elgar was given a copy of the poem in 1889 as a wedding present and it was a well-known work in its own right by the time he came to set it to music. The decision to do so for the 1900 Birmingham Music Festival appears to have been taken somewhat at the last minute, but he later revealed that the poem had been "soaking in my mind for at least eight years".

Newman's poem falls into seven sections: the first is a prologue on earth showing the dying dreamer surrounded by priests and assistants, and the other six parts trace the progress of the Soul through Judgement to Purgatory. It has a total of 900 lines and Elgar retained most of the prologue to form his first part, and he cut down the rest to 300 lines for part two. This formed a balanced libretto with a dramatic contrast between the two states of life and death in the two parts of the work.

Today the work is undoubtedly the most popular of all Elgar's choral works, and is performed more often than The Apostles and The Kingdom, his two other sacred choral masterpieces. It is difficult to remain unmoved by the Priest's invocation to Gerontius to go forth, as part one ends; and in part two, by the chorus of 'Praise to the Holiest'. While early commentators may have been wary of the work's essentially Catholic stance (the composer Charles Villiers Stanford is reported to have said that the work stank of incense), most now are struck more by the dramatic intensity and integrity of the subject.

Elgar himself

The picture often painted of Elgar is of the social outsider, a devout Catholic, snubbed by the English musical establishment but eventually, through the force of his music, reaching the pinnacle of British society. It is therefore perhaps inevitable that, when he produced The Dream of Gerontius, a setting of a poem which explores various tenets of the Catholic faith, people should jump to the conclusion that his Catholicism underlay his whole life. But his faith was never that strong. Ironically, it was the early failure of the work that led him to make the remark "I always knew God was against art", continuing "I have allowed my heart to open once - it is now shut against every religious feeling". This was perhaps pessimistic and overdramatic, but it does show how he felt about his work: he wrote "I've written it out of my insidest inside" and at the end of the score he had copied a quotation from John Ruskin "this is the best of me". Neither the chorus master W. C. Stockley nor the conductor Hans Richter had grasped the complexity of the work and they had allowed insufficient time for rehearsals. Elgar's disappointment was understandable.

The Music

For the first performance, Elgar's friend the publisher August Jaeger wrote an analysis of the score that contained many insights into the meaning of the musical fabric. With the composer's approval, he labelled Elgar's musical motives, or short melodic ideas, and set about explaining their genesis through the piece.

The orchestral prelude begins with hushed strings presenting the Judgement theme. Even more tonally ambiguous is the Fear theme that rises through the hushed strings with each part in a different, unrelated key. This leads into the Prayer theme, closely related in melodic style to chant, and then immediately Elgar transforms the Fear theme into a repetitive figure in the bass, over which he lays Sleep which he characterised as "lying down weary and distressed". As the bass ostinato continues, we hear a descending melody (Miserere) and then immediately a chromatically aspiring melody which somehow always falls down again: Despair. All of this material is combined and transformed, suggesting Gerontius's loneliness and the challenge of his journey to come, until we reach a sequence Commital in which Elgar uses a broad melody to build to the prelude's climax. After this the music ebbs away leaving the Judgement theme alone again once more, whereupon we hear the first utterance of the mortally ill Gerontius.

As the orchestral prelude ends, it is important to remember that the orchestra is not relegated to second place after an initial overture showpiece, but it is on equal footing with the singers, as expressive partner and dramatic commentator. Elgar synthesised the orchestral and motivic development style of Wagner with his own harmonic idiom, and developed a technique of writing for the soloist that allowed a clear understanding but musically flexible setting of the text.

The chorus plays a variety of roles throughout the piece, initially as Gerontius's friends praying at his bedside, and later as Demons and Angelicals, and these are essential in portraying the universality of Newman's theme. Elgar wrote "I imagined Gerontius to be a man like us, not a Priest or a Saint, but a sinner...Therefore I have not filled his part with Church tunes and rubbish but a good, full-blooded romantic, remembered worldliness".

It is significant that Elgar chose to set the part of the Angel for a woman singer: this would have been justifiable simply as a contrast in tessitura from the other roles, but through her guiding the Soul during part two Elgar wrote his greatest love duet, which has echoes of maternal guidance and marital tenderness. Briefly preceded by an echo of bedside prayer from part one. Gerontius's glimpse of God is an unforgettable musical moment for the uninitiated concert-goer. The burial service prayers led by the Priest at Gerontius's passing at the end of part one are mirrored by the Angel of the Agony towards the end of part two with the eternal prayers for 'souls which are so dear to thee': both are awesome figures and add a liturgical solemnity to the musical proceedings. The prayers are followed by the Angel's farewell, during which Elgar pulls together all of his musical material as the Soul passes into Purgatory. We hear the psalm 'Lord, thou hast been our refuge', and then echoes from the earlier hymn 'Praise to the Holiest', before the ambiguous tonality of the very opening of the piece is settled, and the key D major emerges on 'Amen' with a rising, heavenward melody in the strings.

RAPHAELA MANGAN



One of Ireland's leading mezzo-sopranos Raphaela obtained a record-breaking First Class Honours Bachelor's Degree from the TUD Conservatory of Music and Drama, receiving the Michael McNamara Gold Medal for Performance and the TUD Gold Medal for Academic Excellence. Raphaela then went on to obtain a Master's in Music with Distinction from the International Opera Academy, Belgium, graduating top of her class.

Her operatic career has seen her perform across the UK and Europe where her roles have included: Bradamante in Alcina, Ottavia in L'incoronazione di Poppea, Marcellina in The Marriage of Figaro, viève in Pelléas et Mélisande, Idamante in Idomeneo, Glasha and Varvara in Kát'a Kabanová, Buttercup in HMS Pinafore, Euridice

in L'anima del Filosofo, Olga in Eugene Onegin and Mrs Lovett in Sweeney Todd.

At home her performances have included: the title role in Carmen, Cherubino in The Marriage of Figaro, Orfeo in Orfeo ed Euridice, Tessa in The Gondoliers, Bianca in The Rape of Lucretia, Penelope in The Return of Ulysses, Dritte Dame in The Magic Flute, Corrado in Griselda and the role of Hansel in Hansel and Gretel which subsequently won the Irish Times Theatre Award for Best Opera.

A regular in oratorio and concert, Raphaela has performed with all the major Irish Choral Societies and the RTÉ National Symphony Orchestra, RTÉ Concert Orchestra, Irish Baroque Orchestra and the Irish Chamber Orchestra across Ireland in venues such as the National Concert Hall, the Gaiety Theatre, the Olympia Theatre, Cork Opera House, Cork City Hall, the Helix, University Concert Hall and the National Opera House.

Internationally she has given concerts at the Usher Hall, Edinburgh, Ghent Opera House, Belgium, Buxton Opera House, the Estoril Congress Center, Portugal, La Grange, France, The McEwan Hall, Edinburgh and the Castellammare SuperCinema Theatre, Italy.

As a multi-award winner, Raphaela received The Award for Excellence at the Estoril OperaPlus Festival, Portugal, The Award for Artistic Merit Naples, Italy, The Thomas Moore Bursary at the NCH, Dublin, The Dramatic Cup, Vincent O'Brien, Dermot Troy, Mezzo Solo and the Oliver O'Brien Bursary at the RDS Feis Ceoil, Dublin. As a recording artist, Raphaela has worked on critically acclaimed albums such as: The Thomas Moore Complete Song Collection; *My Gentle Harp* and the *Complete Songs and Airs of John F. Larchet* with Champs Hill Records UK.

GAVAN RING



Hailing from Cahersiveen in County Kerry, Irish tenor Dr Gavan Ring studied at the Schola Cantorum at St. Finian's College Mullingar before reading education and music at Dublin City University. As an alumnus of the National Opera Studio in London, Gavan is also the first opera singer and the youngest graduate to complete doctoral studies at the Royal Irish Academy of Music. Gavan's ground-breaking doctoral research on Robert O'Dwyer's Irish language opera Eithne led to the work's first performance in 107 years. A member of the inaugural Cara O'Sullivan Associate Artist Programme at Cork Opera House,

Gavan is also a multiple prize-winner at competitions such as the Wigmore Hall Song Competition and the Concorso Lirico Internazionale di Portofino. Gavan lectures in voice at Munster Technological University Cork School of Music. Gavan is also the Artistic Director of Drogheda Classical Music.

Concert highlights include performances with the London Symphony Orchestra at the BBC Proms and Lucerne Festival under Sir Simon Rattle, the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment at the Royal Festival Hall under Sir Mark Elder and the Munich Radio Symphony Orchestra at the Prinzregententheater under Keri Lynn-Wilson. Recital work includes regular broadcasts on BBC Radio 3 and RTÉ Lyric FM plus appearances at Wigmore Hall, the Oxford Lieder Festival and the Ludlow English Song Festival collaborating with pianists such as Simon Lepper, Graham Johnson, Eugene Asti, Sholto Kynoch and Iain Burnside. Opera highlights include leading roles at Cork Opera House, Garsington Opera, Glyndebourne, Irish National Opera, La Monnaie De Munt, Opéra Royal de Versailles, Opera Holland Park, Opera North, Scottish Opera, Welsh National Opera and Wexford Festival Opera.

Discography includes Barry: Alice's Adventures Underground (Signum Classics 2021), Larchet: The Complete Songs and Airs (Champs Hill 2020), Rossini: Sigismondo (Bayerischen Rundfunks 2019), O'Dwyer: Eithne (RTÉ Lyric FM 2018), Gilbert and Sullivan: HMS Pinafore (Linn Records 2016), Offenbach: Fantasio (Opera Rara 2014) and Fleischmann: Orchestral Works (RTÉ Lyric FM 2010). Gavan is kindly supported by Howard Gatiss, the Arts Council of Ireland/An Chomhairle Ealaíon, the Skellig Six 18 Distillery, Andrew and Lucy Penny, Dominic and Corina Buckwell, Hugh and Adah Sachs-Simpson and Michael and Giancarla Alen-Buckley.

GYULA NAGY



Gyula Nagy is a Hungarian baritone based in Ireland. He trained at the Royal Irish Academy of Music with teacher Philip O'Reilly, then at the National Opera Studio, London, and he is an alumnus of the Jette Parker Young Artists Programme (2016-2018) at the Royal Opera House Covent Garden.

He appeared in the title role in Monteverdi's II Ritorno d'Ulisse in Patria for Opera Collective Ireland, as the Gypsy in Mussorgsky's The Fair at Sorochyntsi for Komische Oper Berlin, as Schaunard in La Bohéme for the Royal Opera House Covent

Garden, as Pizarro in Beethoven's Fidelio for Lyric Opera, Dublin.

Recently he sang Escamillo in Carmen for Opera North, made his role debut in the title role of Verdi's Rigoletto at the Auditorio Nacional de Música, Madrid, appeared as Sharpless in Puccini's Madama Butterfly for the Royal Opera House Covent Garden and for Lyric Opera, Dublin, sang Lescaut in Puccini's Manon Lescaut for Dorset Opera Festival, the title role of Rossini's Guillaume Tell for Irish National Opera, Urok in Paderewski's Manru for Opéra National de Lorraine, Alfio/Tonio in Cavalleria Rusticana/Pagliacci for Cambridge Philharmonic and Valentin in Gounod's Faust for Irish National Opera.

In 2024-25, he appears as Leicester/Beefeater in The Critic by Stanford for Wexford Festival Opera, as Don Magnifico in Rossini's La Cenerentola for Opéra National de Lorraine/Théâtre de Caen/Opéra de Reims/Grand Théâtre de Luxembourg and as the baritone soloist for the staged performance version of Carmina Burana for the Hungarian State Opera.

As a concert performer, Gyula has worked with many orchestras and ensembles, including the Irish Baroque Orchestra, the RTÉ NSO, the RTÉ Concert Orchestra, the Limerick Choral Union, the Camerata Kilkenny, the Dun Laoghaire Choral Society, the Carlow Choral Society, the Surrey Festival Choir and the Cambridge Philharmonic. Most recently he appeared in recitals and concerts with the Goethe Choir, with the Kilkenny Choir and at the West Wicklow Festival with soprano Claudia Boyle and pianist Fiachra Garvey. Gyula regularly collaborates with organist Judit Máté, most recently they performed organ-baritone programmes commemorating the 100th anniversary of the death of Charles Villiers Stanford at the Dun Laoghaire Organ Concerts, at the Waterford International Organ Festival and at the Galway Cathedral Recitals.

KEITH PASCOE



In 2016 Keith Pascoe received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Concert Hall, Dublin for his work with the Vanbrugh Quartet. He is an internationally respected violinist, conductor, lecturer, and editor based in Cork, Ireland.

Principal conductor of the Cork Symphony Orchestra from 2004 until 2015, when he was appointed conductor of the newly established Cork Fleischmann Symphony Orchestra. During that period he conducted an extensive repertoire of symphonies, and accompanied such soloists as singers Cara

O'Sullivan, Majella Cullagh, Mary Hegarty, Sinead Ni Mhurchu, Raphaela Mangan, John Molloy, and the The Three Irish Sopranos; violinists Mairéad Hickey, Sarah Sexton, Megan Chan, Tasmin Little, Patrick Rafter, and Nigel Kennedy with whom he also played Bach's concerto for two violins; cellists Christopher Marwood, Julian Lloyd Webber, Yseult Cooper-Stockdale, Zoe Nagle; pianists Ciara Moroney, David Syme, Kevin Jansson, Barry Douglas, Michael McHale and Artur Pizarro; the Fleischmann Choir, as well as the Army Band of 1 Southern Brigade: International choirs including the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Choir, and the Harlow Chorus. He opened Cork's International Choral Festival notably with A Sea Symphony by Vaughan-Williams in 2008, and Verdi's Requiem in 2017. He has conducted at the Philharmonic Hall, Liverpool, and at the National Concert Hall, Dublin. He conducted the DIT Conservatory's production of Britten's opera Nove's Fludde in Dublin (2013), and in the same year gave the premiere of Paul Alday's first symphony (1816), the first symphony known to have been composed in Ireland in the nineteenth century. Composers that have created works for the Orchestra include Ian Wilson, whose Fleischmann Variations (2016) were especially memorable. Ian Wilson is currently composing a work for violin and orchestra for Keith and the CFSO.

Liverpool born Keith Pascoe's professional career began after prizewinning studies at the Royal College of Music, London where he studied violin with Jaroslav Vanecek, piano with Eileen Reynolds, and conducting with Norman del Mar. His professional life began in 1981, when he became a founding member (and first leader) of the Chamber Orchestra of Europe. Subsequent full-time positions included third concertmaster of the London Philharmonic at the age of twenty-three, assistant director of the Academy of St. Martin-in-the Fields (with whom he has appeared as soloist), and ten years with exclusive EMI artists, the Britten Quartet. From 1998-2017, he was a member of the Vanbrugh Quartet, artistsin-residence to University College Cork. The Vanbrugh continue to tour and play concerts with guest artists. In January 2019, he was invited to lead an international orchestra in Bologna, Italy to celebrate the fifth anniversary of the death of conductor Claudio Abbado. He is lecturer in Chamber Music and Violin at the Conservatoire of Music at TU Dublin. He lives in Cork City, Ireland.

EAST CORK CHORAL SOCIETY

East Cork Choral Society was founded in 1979 with the express intention of bringing all the major oratorios to Cork audiences. They have stayed faithful to this ideal and have sung a vast number of works from Bach, Britten, Mendelssohn, Handel, Haydn, Rossini, Verdi and many more. They also, intentionally, have given a platform to young soloists, many of whom have gone on to have stellar international careers. They have collaborated with other choirs giving them the opportunity to sing oratorio with an orchestra and soloists often travelling elsewhere to perform together. The choir has also, from time to time, joined forces with local schools and given a summer concert where the children are introduced to choral singing. Over the years, they have supported many charities. Our 2023 City Hall performance of Mendelssohn's Elijah raised over €11,000 for Marymount.

The founding conductor was Andrew Padmore. Colin Nicholls took over in 1984. Under his baton the choir has had a very stable membership of about 60 singers. Friendship, fun and hard work are enjoyed by all. East Cork Choral Society are honoured to be opening the Cork International Choral Festival for the sixth time.



THE GUINNESS CHOIR

The Guinness Choir was established in 1951 by Victor Leeson, who was a young member on the management staff of the Guinness Brewery in Dublin. The members of the Choir were also Guinness employees. The Choir gave its first performance in May 1951 and has been at the forefront of choral music in Ireland for nearly 75 years. Victor Leeson conducted the Choir until 1984 with early performances of the great oratorios of Bach and Handel, many of which were performed in Dublin for the first time. As well as Bach, Handel, Mozart and Haydn, the Choir's repertoire encompasses many of the choral works of all the major composers from the 17th to 20th centuries.

David Milne followed John Dexter's time as Musical Director, from 1991 to 2022, a span of over thirty years. Highlights under David's direction include Verdi's Requiem at the Waterfront Hall in Belfast, with the Belfast Philharmonic Choir and the Ulster Orchestra, the first performance of Handel's Messiah in the new Wexford Opera House in 2009 and a performance of Verdi's Requiem in the Grand Canal Theatre in 2011 with the University of Dublin Choral Society.

The choir appointed Ciarán Kelly as its new Music Director on David's retirement in 2022. Under Ciarán's musical guidance the choir has performed several Irish premieres of contemporary composers, including Ola Gjeilo's Dreamweaver and Jake Runestad's Cello Songs as well and an ambitious double bill of Mozart's Requiem and C Minor Mass in April 2023. The choir's performance in December 2024 of Bach's Christmas Oratorio was particularly well received.

The Guinness Choir is proud of its association, over many years, with the Cork international Choral Festival. Known as the St. James's Gate Musical Society (SJGMS) until 1964, the choir won first prize in the International Competition A (Mixed Voice Choirs) at the Cork International Choral Festival in 1960, 1961 and 1963. They were the

first choir to win two years in a row and the only choir to win that competition three times. The SJGMS also won the International Female Voice competition in 1963. In 1964 they finished second in the International Competition A, and won both the International Female and Male Voice competitions. The choir competed again in the International Competition A in 1966. They also contributed to the Festival non-competitively in 1965, 1966, 1981 and 2003.

In 2001, as part of our 50th Anniversary celebrations, we proudly introduced the inaugural Victor Leeson Perpetual Trophy to the Choir of the Year at the Cork Choral Festival. This award is presented each year to the outstanding Irish choir at the festival. In 2016 they welcomed the sponsorship of DPS Engineering at a challenging time for the choir when the brewery withdrew funding. In 2024 they were delighted to announce Spry Finance as our lead Sponsor. In conjunction with our loyal Patrons and Friends of the choir and the honorary patronage of the Rt. Hon. Earl of Iveagh, Edward Guinness, the Guinness Choir looks forward to our 75th Anniversary with enthusiasm and ambition.



MADRIGAL '75

Madrigal '75 was formed in 1975 by students of University College, Cork with the aim of performing madrigals and entering competitions, including the madrigal competition of the then Cork Choral Festival that same year, so the title Madrigal '75 seemed a natural choice of name for the choir!

Over the years the choir has featured prominently in the Cork International Choral Festival, participating in the international competitions as well as performing commissioned works at the contemporary music seminars. In more recent times, the choir presented the opening night Gala Concert in 2015, and the Evocations Concert in 2014 and again in 2019.

In 2018, the choir collaborated with Sestina vocal ensemble, for a performance of Bach's St John Passion at the East Cork Early Music Festival, and also gave concerts in 2019 with other distinguished choirs such as New Dublin Voices. In addition, the choir has performed in festivals and competitions in Italy, Switzerland, France, Spain, and most recently, Scotland, presenting concerts in Glasgow Cathedral and St. Mary's Episcopal Cathedral, Edinburgh.

The choir is conducted by James Taylor, who began his early musical training singing as a Cathedral chorister at Southwell Minster, UK. He completed his postgraduate studies at McGill University, Montreal, and has worked as an organist, harpsichordist and choral conductor in New Zealand, Canada and Ireland, where he works as a lecturer at MTU Cork School of Music.

Madrigal '75 are Artists-in-Residence at MTU Cork School of Music, and perform concerts there on a regular basis, most notably their sell-out Christmas concerts, which have become an established tradition in the Cork concert calendar. The choir released a second CD in February 2020, featuring works by Cork composer Séamas de Barra. This year marks the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the choir and they are very proud to perform at the Cork International Choral Festival as part of their anniversary celebrations.



CORK FLEISCHMANN SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

The Cork Fleischmann Symphony Orchestra was established in 2016 in honour of Professor Aloys Fleischmann of UCC. A highly influential figure, Professor Fleischmann both founded and was instrumental in the formation of many organisations during his life which impacted the development of music and music education in Ireland. His formation of the Cork Symphony Orchestra in 1934, which he conducted until his death in 1992, was central to the development of orchestral music outside Dublin.

In continuation of this legacy and with the imprimatur of the Fleischmann family, the current orchestra under conductor Keith Pascoe, has presented many highly acclaimed concerts. Our aim, in addition to performing orchestral repertoire is to showcase young emerging talent, to bring international soloists to our audience and to promote new compositions for orchestra. In this regard they have worked with young Cork soloists Mairead Hickey, Kevin Jansson, Louise Sullivan and Yseult Cooper Stockdale. They have worked also with international soloists Tasmin Little, Michael McHale, Artur Pizzaro and Patrick Rafter. They have performed several new pieces including lan Wilson's 'Variations on the Name of Fleischmann' and in May of this year, with the choir of St. Marys Dominican Church, they performed a re-orchestration by Barry Russell of Fauré's Requiem with soloists Fiona O' Reilly and Owen Gilhooley in May 2024. They are committed to bringing music to the community and as such have given an open air concert Fleischmann In the Glen as part of the 2017 Cork Midsummer Festival. In November 2023, they were proud to be asked to perform at the Lord Mayor's Remember and Renew Gala Concert which was the finale to the Decade of Centenary Celebrations in the city.

SYNG SELECTED [DENMARK]

Conductor Morten Vinther Sörensen

Syng Selected is a modern a cappella choir consisting of 31 of Denmark's most talented young choir singers between the ages of 18-30. Syng Selected was founded by the Danish Youth Choral Association SYNG in 2014, and since then, it has become an established part of the evolving Danish vocal music scene.

In recent years, the focus has been on writing, arranging, and producing original music for and with the choir, as well as maintaining a strong narrative in concerts. "We try to utilise as many nuances of the human voice as possible in order to connect to the audience in the most direct way - through music, through emotions" says Line Groth Riis.

Syng Selected performs with amplification and brings a natural Nordic sound carried by the energy of the young singers. The concerts revolve around the theme of courage - courage to trust yourself, courage to fall and get back up, courage to grow up, and to be fragile and ask for help. "It's a powerful theme, especially when it comes from courageous young people - actually, I can sometimes get overwhelmed by the impact in rehearsals and on stage, which in return reminds me to stay courageous in my own life," Morten



Vinther adds.

In addition to performing on several prominent stages in Denmark, the choir has toured in Sweden, Germany, Israel, the US, and Turkey. The choir received international recognition in 2020 when they won the ACA Idol in New York, and the general acknowledgement of the choir has also led to performances with the Danish singer Stine Bramsen, Latvian Voices, Israeli choir Vocalosity, and the Swedish vocal group The Real Group, to name a few. The choir is a project choir and changes conductor every three years.

Currently, Syng Selected is conducted by Line Groth Riis and Morten Vinther; Line is best known from her years in Danish XL choir Vocal Line and vocal group Postyr, and Morten for his decade in the Swedish vocal group The Real Group.

CHAMBER CHOIR IRELAND

As the country's national chamber choir, Chamber Choir Ireland holds a unique place in the cultural life of Ireland. Through broadcasts, streaming, and live performances, they bring the joy of world-class choral music to over a million listeners each year.

CCI's programming is as diverse as it is daring, rediscovering rarely heard treasures of early music like Andrea Gabrieli's Edipo Tiranno, performing choral masterworks like Rachmaninov's All Night Vigil, and championing leading Irish and international composers through commissions and premieres. Recent commissions include exciting new works by Caroline Shaw, John Luther Adams, Gabriel Jackson, Cassandra Miller, David Fennessy, and Stephen McNeff.



CCI's recordings are consistently met with critical acclaim, with releases on Harmonia Mundi, Orchid Classics, Naxos, and RTÉ lyric fm labels. Their 2020 release, letters, received a 5-star review from the Irish Times and was the recipient of a New Music Scotland Award. Their latest release, Folks' Music (LCMS), was featured in the New Yorker's Notable Classical Recordings of 2023.

Based at Ireland's National Concert Hall, the choir tours extensively throughout the island of Ireland including annual performances at Kilkenny Arts Festival, New Music Dublin and Cork International Choral Festival. Internationally, CCI has toured to the USA, UK, Belgium, Estonia, Russia, Germany, and South America.

Beyond the concert stage, CCI is deeply committed to working closely with communities across Ireland through its Learning and Participation activities. Whether inspiring young composers in schools, or supporting amateur and community choirs nationwide, CCI is passionate about making the reach of choral music in Ireland inclusive and accessible to all. CCI believes in ensuring the future of choral music, providing professional development programmes for composers in partnership with the Contemporary Music Centre, and training the next generation of professional choral singers in the CCI Studio.

Chamber Choir Ireland receives principal funding from the Arts Council/an Chomhairle Ealaíon, and support from Dublin City Council and the Arts Council of Northern Ireland through its National Lottery Fund. CCI is a resident ensemble at the National Concert Hall of Ireland, Associate Artists to Dublin City University, and a member of TENSO, the network of professional chamber choirs in Europe.

Led by Gabriel Crouch, Chamber Choir Ireland returns to Cork International Choral Festival with a programme exploring issues of homelessness, displacement, and belonging. In the title work, Forgotten Peoples, Veljo Tormis attempted to preserve the musical heritage of the minority groups that live along the shores of the Gulf of Finland, whose languages and ways of life are in danger of disappearing. Michael Gordon's Anonymous Man follows the composer's changing New York neighbourhood, from industrial warehouse district to residential area, and the impact on his unhoused neighbours. The programme will feature world premieres of new commissions by Emma O'Halloran (Ireland) and Francisco del Piño (Argentina).

An annual tradition at Cork International Choral Festival, this performance will also feature the world premiere of Babel by Donnchadh Mac Aodha, the winning entry in this year's Seán Ó Riada Composition Competition.

If the name of Josquin Desprez (1450/1455-1521) today ranks among such consummate Renaissance artists as Raphael and Michelangelo, then this was no less the case in his own day. Josquin was truly "a legend in his own time", the most famous of the Franco-Flemish composers who sought fame and fortune in Italy. This fame opened



the door to appointments in top ensembles in Milan and Ferrara, but surely his most towering achievement was as singer and composer at the Sistine Chapel in Rome.

In this programme, Cappella Pratensis sings its core repertoire with music composed by Josquin for the celebration of the Annunciation in the Sistine Chapel. In this evocation of the Roman liturgy, pride of place is taken by his exquisite Missa Ave maris stella. The movements of the mass are complemented by the plainchant propers, sung from a facsimile of a Roman gradual from which Josquin himself would have sung. The program is rounded out by Marian motets, including a setting of the hymn on which the mass is based, Ave maris stella, in which Josquin added new verses to an existing setting by his illustrious predecessor, Guillaume Dufay (1397-1474).

CAPPELLA PRATENSIS

For almost forty years, Cappella Pratensis has been renowned for its innovative approach to the performance of Renaissance polyphonic music, being one of only a handful of professional ensembles in the world who perform directly from historical notation, as opposed to transcriptions in the form of a modern choral score. In recent years, the ensemble has dived further into the musical traditions surrounding this repertoire by exploring historical methods of improvisation and pedagogies, as well as working within the contexts of liturgical reconstruction. The result is an inherently immersive approach, in which the performers draw on a truly embodied relationship with past musical cultures in order to provide convincing and engaging performances.

In addition to regular appearances at concert venues in The Netherlands and Belgium, Cappella Pratensis has performed at leading international festivals and concert series throughout Europe, North America, South America, and Japan, including the Boston, Berkeley, Utrecht, and York Early Music Festivals. The ensemble's recordings have met with critical acclaim and distinctions from the press, including the Diapason d'Or, the Prix Choc and, for the last three CDs, three consecutive Gramophone Editor's Choice mentions. Gramophone magazine recognised the ensemble's recording of the Ockeghem Requiem as the best out of more than twenty recordings made over the last forty years. In 2022, Cappella Pratensis won the prestigious REMA-EEMN Heritage Project of the Year Award with the CD recording Apostola apostolorum. The ensemble's 2023 recording of Obrecht's Missa Maria zart won the Premio Abbiati della critica musicale, was awarded with a Disco Exceptional by the Spanish music magazine Scherzo, and was rated five stars by the Spanish magazine Ritmo.

In 2025 the Cork International Choral Festival is proud to present for the fourth year the International Choral Conducting Course as part of the Education Programme. The course will take place from 29th April to 2nd May. Designed for anyone with experience in leading choirs of all kinds, the four-day intensive hands-on course will help develop conducting skills under the leadership of expert international guest tutors, Anna Fűri and Shane Lynch. The course will culminate in an Ensemble Workshop with Chamber Choir Ireland on Friday 2nd May.

Practical sessions in the Alexander Technique, Byzantine Chant, conducting styles and techniques, and choral leadership will offer attendees an opportunity of learning and upskilling. 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SEÁN Ó RIADA COMPOSITION COMPETITION

The Seán Ó Riada Competition was initiated in 1972, and today, the present format of the Seán Ó Riada Competition offers a platform for Irish composers to have their work judged and rewarded purely on its own merits without the judges being influenced by the reputation or status of the composer. All compositions are submitted under a pseudonym, with the author's real name not being revealed until after the judges' decision has been made. Works composed in the Irish language are encouraged. The competition has, as a central aim, the intention of providing Irish choirs with fresh, authentic material for inclusion in their programmes. The competition has attracted the attention of many highly-regarded composers, with past winners including Solfa Carlisle, Rhona Clarke, Patrick Connolly, Frank Corcoran, Séamas de Barra, Eoghan Desmond, Michael Holohan, Marian Ingoldsby, Donal MacErlaine, Simon MacHale, Kevin O'Connell, Amanda Feery, Criostóir Ó Loingsigh, Donal Sarsfield, James May, Peter Leavy, Norah Constance Walsh, Daragh Black Hynes, Laura Heneghan and last year's winner Anselm McDonnell. With hundreds of compositions being submitted since 2011 in the new format, the Seán Ó Riada Composition Competition clearly highlights the number of composers now working and living in Ireland, and further demonstrates the Cork International Choral Festival's continuing commitment to encourage the composition and performance of contemporary music.

DONNCHADH MAC AODHA 2025 WINNING PIECE: BABEL



Donnchadh Mac Aodha is a composer and multiinstrumentalist from Dundalk, Co. Louth. In 2024, he graduated from UCC with a 1st-class honours degree in Music and Irish, where he was a Quercus Creative and Performing Arts Scholar.

Donnchadh's current compositional work draws inspiration from his grounding in traditional music and the Irish language, intermingled with his training in contemporary composition, led primarily by John Godfrey at UCC. His pieces have been performed at the Edinburgh International Harp Festival, Ostrava Days Festival, West Wicklow Chamber Music Festival, The Irish Composers Collective Festival and the New Ross Piano Festival. In 2024 he was commissioned to write a suite for Consairtín, premiered in Glór, Ennis. Donnchadh's final-year Major Study composition project, Éist le Fuaim

na hAbhann: Echoing Sean-nós in Contemporary Classical Composition, won the Danijela Kulezic-Wilson Undergraduate Award for Exceptional Innovation in Research.

Donnchadh has performed extensively in Ireland, Europe, and beyond. A four-time All-Ireland Champion at Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann, he has been the recipient of numerous awards, including the Donal 'Doc' Gleeson Award, UCC Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann bursary, and the Mícheál Ó hÉidhin medal. He was also a finalist in the Bonn Óir Seán Ó Riada competition three times, and holds an Advanced Recital Certificate in piano from RIAM.

SEMINAR WITH RODDY O'KEEFFE THE GUINNESS CHOIR AT THE CORK INTERNATIONAL CHORAL FESTIVAL, 1959 TO 1966

Roddy O'Keeffe is a Lecturer at Munster Technological University Cork School of Music, and is based in the Musicianship and Academic Studies Department. F.M. Alexander, an Australian actor, began a life-long study of himself as he tried to find a solution to his vocal difficulties. What he discovered is relevant for us all. How we are thinking, as we carry out a movement, can have a profound influence on our ability to move easily, freely and efficiently.

This informative introductory lecture and demonstration will introduce you to the Interactive Teaching Method (ITM) approach to the Alexander Technique. You will learn some key concepts that you can apply immediately to improve your mental and physical performance. By learning more about ourselves and the principles which govern all movement behaviour, we can greatly improve the quality of our performance, and greatly enhance the quality of our lives in general.

Mary Shorten has been involved in choral music for many years as a chorister, vocal tutor and conductor. In 2012, she graduated as an ITM Alexander Technique teacher, having studied with Don Weed, Head of ITM Training in Bristol. She is also a trainer on the current ITM teacher training course.



You don't need to be able to sing, it's simply about lending your voice and experiencing first-hand the enjoyment and sense of community that lies at the heart of choral singing.

SUZZIE VANGO

Passionate about the arts and choral education, Suzzie's highenergy workshops and dynamic choral programmes have gained her an international reputation, working with singers of all ages. In demand as a soprano, choral director and vocal coach, she directs and sings with the critically acclaimed female a cappella quintet Papagena, conducts the National Children's Choir of Great Britain and is an adjudicator and guest conductor for many UK vocal ensembles and festivals. Recent collaborations have seen her working with: the London Symphony Orchestra, Vache Baroque, Sing for Pleasure, Sing Ireland, ABCD and the National Youth Choirs.

She has run projects in Uganda, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, China, Thailand, the USA and across Europe, with recent visits to Scotland, Ireland, France and Kenya.

Suzzie is Associate Artist at the University of Warwick, Singing Teacher at the University of Birmingham, and a vocal tutor for Ex Cathedra Education's award winning projects: Singing Playgrounds and Singing Medicine. She is Schools Programme Leader for Music of Life Foundation and founded their school choirs project over ten years ago. Her own compositions have been published in Ex Cathedra's SingMaker series, Sing for Pleasure publications, Choral Music Publications and in OUP's Carols for Choirs 6.

Her career as a soprano has taken her around the world, conducting, performing and recording with some of the top UK vocal ensembles, and her multi-award winning warm up book 'How to Make Your Choir Sound Awesome', written with Lucy Hollins, was published by Banks Music Publications in 2022.

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

A WORKSHOP ON BYZANTINE CHANT

WITH DR ALEXANDER KHALIL

This talk and interactive workshop explores the relationship between the notations on the page and what a cantor might actually sing. Melodies may have multiple correct realisations that a cantor must negotiate in relation to received tradition and practical necessity. The presentation will explore some of these variations in theory and in practice.

Dr Alexander Khalil is a senior lecturer in music and joint head of music at University College Cork. An ethnomusicologist and cognitive scientist, his work investigates the interpersonal temporal dynamics of music making. He is a cantor in the Greek Orthodox chant tradition, a student of the late John Mestakides, former protopsaltis (or "first cantor") of Jerusalem. His doctoral research investigates the present-day tradition at one of its most significant centers: the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople. More recently, he has extended his work to communities in diaspora.

CHORAL ART

ARTIST: JASON O'GORMAN NATIONAL COMPETITION TROPHIES

Jason O'Gorman is a multidisciplinary designer, illustrator and artist. He grew up in Cork, and has travelled all around it. He now lives in Cork with his wife, three kids and a sarcastic sense of humour. His art mixes his love of Cork with other influences on his life. He has a deep curiosity about the world, art, music, science, nature, the cosmos - how it all fits together and why things are the way they are. Art gives a voice to describe this world, a way to interpret and make sense of it. He likes good ideas, drawing, painting and talking about himself in the third person. He is self taught, does not pay any attention to trends in the art and design world, and would therefore be considered an unconventional artist. He works from his studio some days, at home other days and not at all if the sun is shining!



OUR AWARDS AND ARCHIVAL REPOSITORIES

Over the last few years, an initiative commenced over a decade by festival president (then director) John Fitzpatrick, and trophies coordinator, David J. Butler, has been gradually developed in the obtaining of a location to display our unique collection of contemporary, vintage and antique national awards and reserve trophies.

The first part of this collection stems from an initiative commenced in 1994 by John Fitzpatrick, commissioning artists to use sympathetic media communicating the spirit of the Festival in wood, ceramic, glass, enamel, or metal. From the outset, the Festival retained a reserve item, thus allowing for a complete collection to be mounted in this display. A unique collection of some thirty limited edition annually commissioned National Trophies is the result.

The second part centres upon our non-current perpetual awards, a significant display of twelve mainly vintage trophies (dating from 1954 to 1983) of plaque or cup design – silver plate, metal alloy, Bakelite, wood and glass featuring – together with a particularly fine antique silver-gilt early nineteenth century cup. Some of these were awarded over several decades; others for only a very few years.

The MTU Cork School of Music Fleischmann Library now houses a permanent display case with trophies and the more delicate contemporary pieces well lit upon its shelves, while an adjacent wall display of framed commissions compliments what will become a major hub for choral studies. There will be a QR code catalogue to facilitate further research.

This year, in light of the 70th Festival, this initiative has expanded to encompass the festival archives and collections of music and ephemera. To this end, the curatorial notes of festivals past have joined our existing files at The Cork City and County Archives, where they may be consulted by appointment by future researchers. Similarly, our collections of festival ephemera – programmes, syllabi, festival and visiting choir recordings – have been donated. A complete collection of original programmes and syllabi is available to consult, by appointment, at The Rory Gallagher Music Library – Cork City Library and at The MTU Fleischmann Library – Cork School of Music. The latter location is in possession of the large collection of CDs, cassettes and VHS of visiting choirs, presented to the festival office over several decades. University College Cork music library houses a significant (incomplete) collection of festival programmes. The university has also been sent a set of 'Highlights of the Festival' CDs – an initiative which ran from the late 1990s to 2016 – to mark our 70th year.

Also in tribute to our festival anniversary, a display of ephemera, awards and photographic panels will be on display in the entrance foyer of Cork City Library, Grand Parade this spring.

It has been a pleasure further expand and develop our repository and archival initiatives over the past year and, on behalf of the Festival Board, I would like to thank the several libraries and archives for their great courtesy and consideration throughout.





SHANE LYNCH [USA]




Shane Lynch, an award-winning conductor, composer and music educator, assumed the position Director of Choral Activities at Washington and Lee University in the Fall of 2009. He conducts the University Singers, W&L's internationally competitive touring choir, and the Glee Club. Dr Lynch also oversees the University's innovative and unique choral conductor mentorship/ teacher preparation program, the CCMP. Dr Lynch is a soughtafter clinician and quest conductor, having worked with groups throughout the United States, Europe, and Asia. Quite interested in musical scholarship, some of his recent research includes trends of Neo-Impressionism in modern American choral music and eurhythmic movements in the choral rehearsal and performance setting. He is also noted for conducting large-scale productions, including operas, oratorios, and festival concerts. Dr Lynch has led choirs to festival and competition performances across the globe. including leading the University Singers as the first American choir ever to compete in the City of Derry International Choir Festival.

Dr Lynch has received numerous accolades as a musician and educator, including the Junior Faculty Member of the Year at Monmouth College and the Outstanding Faculty Service Award at the University of Wisconsin—Barron. As an active composer interested in a wide variety of compositional styles and mediums, he has commissioned compositions ranging from octavos to choral and orchestral works. His piece Joseph and Grace premiered in Ireland for the 100th Anniversary of the Easter Rising and won the National Collegiate Choral Organization composition contest, and he has served as Composer-in-Residence for music festival across the globe.

Prior to his appointment at Washington and Lee, Dr Lynch served as Visiting Director of Choral Activities at Monmouth College (Illinois) and Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wisconsin—Barron as well as several past positions in church music and teaching high school science.

Shane Lynch graduated from Concordia College (Moorhead, Minnesota), with degrees in Music and Physics, received the Master of Music degree in Conducting from the University of Northern Colorado, and completed his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Choral Conducting at the University of Washington.

ANNA FÜRI [HUNGARY]



Anna Fűri graduated with a degree in Choral Conducting and Vocal Pedagogy in 1997 from the Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest, where she studied with Péter Erdei, Valér Jobbágy, Salamon Kamp, Zoltán Kövics and István Párkai.

She received her second degree in jazz singing in 2005 at the Liszt Academy Teacher Training College in Budapest. Additionally, she has participated in conducting courses with Peter Broadbent, Gary Graden, Hans-Christoph Rademann, Georg Christoph Sandmann, Máté Szabó Sipos and Mikael Wedar.

She completed her doctoral studies at the Liszt Academy in 2022. She spent a year and a half in Dresden studying choral conducting with Hans-Christoph Rademann, and orchestral conducting with Georg Christoph Sandmann under an Erasmus scholarship.

She joined the Kodály Institute of the Liszt Academy of Music in 2019 where she teaches Solfége and conducting, and conducts the Institute's choir.

As a choir conductor since 2009, she has conducted the Chorus Matricanus Female Choir of Százhalombatta, which has received numerous awards at international competitions, including a gold diploma at the International Choir Festival in Preveza (Greece) in 2012, and a bronze diploma in Gorizia (Italy) in 2015. She was also granted the Special Conductor Prize at the Competition in Preveza, as well as the Zsolt Szesztay Special Prize at the Bartók Béla International Choir Competition in Debrecen for the performance of a contemporary piece in 2014.

She has led conducting and solfège workshops in Limerick, Katowice, Székelyudvarhely and Kecskemét.

ANNE KOHLER [GERMANY]

Anne Kohler is a Professor for Choral Conducting at the Detmold University of Music, Germany. She is also the artistic leader of the German National Youth Choir. Besides teaching her class of First Study Choral Conductors, she conducts the University's Chamber Choir Detmold and the Vocal Ensemble "Pop-Up". She studied conducting, piano and classical voice and developed her studies further through masterclasses with Eric Ericsson, Frieder Bernius and Tonu Kaljuste. She has been guest chorus master for the SWR Vocal Ensemble, the WDR and Berlin Radio Choir for Marcus Creed, Pierre Boulez and Sir Roger Norrington. She has won first prizes at International Choir Competitions with Detmold University's Chamber Choir and her ensemble Pop-Up.

Anne Kohler's work with jazz choirs has been influenced and developed through workshops with The Real Group, Jens Johansen and Thierry Lalo, and through close connections to the arrangers Martin Carbow and Oliver Gies. Courses and workshops on conducting, vocal technique and jazz and pop-choir conducting have seen her travel all over the country and abroad. Her vocal ensemble Pop-Up recorded their fourth CD in 2019 and has won first prizes at the International Choir Competitions.



ORLA FLANAGAN [IRELAND]



Orla Flanagan is a Dublin-based choral conductor and music educator. She studied conducting with Prof. Péter Erdei at the Kodály Institute in Hungary and holds a doctorate in performance from the Royal Irish Academy of Music. She is an Assistant Professor of Music at Trinity College, Dublin, where she teaches modules in choral conducting, aural training and performance, and supervises doctoral research.

Orla conducts the mixed-voice choir Mornington Singers, an award-winning ensemble which has appeared at international festivals in Ireland, Italy, Canada, France, Latvia and Slovenia. The choir was awarded the Grand Prix at the 2019 International Baltic Sea Choir Competition in Jūrmala, Latvia. As a conductor, Orla has also gained numerous awards at international competitions, including the MacCurtain & McSwiney Award for programming at Cork International Choral Festival on three occasions, and a special prize for interpretation at the 10th International Choral Competition, Maribor, Slovenia. Orla and the choir are committed to the creation and promotion of contemporary music and have recently released two CD recordings of contemporary Irish choral works: Under-Song (2017) and To the Northeast: The Choral Music of John Buckley (2019).

Orla's work with professional choral ensembles includes Milltown Chamber Choir, EnsemBéal, Resurgam, and Chamber Choir Ireland, with whom she performed at the White House for President Barack Obama. She enjoys giving choral workshops and adjudicating at festivals nationally and internationally. Orla is the Artistic Director of the Sing Ireland International Choral Conducting Summer School.

PASI HYÖKKI [FINLAND]

Master of Music and choir conductor Pasi Hyökki (b. 1970) is the artistic director of the Tapiola Choir, YL Male Voice Choir and the chamber choir EMO Ensemble, which he founded in 2000. With the Talla Vocal Ensemble, EMO Ensemble and the Cantabile choir, Hyökki has won several international choir and ensemble singing competitions. He actively records with all his choirs, also acting as an editing producer himself. Recordings with Talla Vocal Ensemble, EMO Ensemble and YL have been selected as choral records of the year. The Klemetti award was awarded to Hyökki in 2014 and in 2023 he received the Heinz Hoffmann medal of the Finnish Youth Choir Association.

As a sopranist, Pasi Hyökki has performed, among others, as the soprano soloist of Handel's Messiah oratorio and Mozart's Requiem, in his solo concert at the Viitasaari Time of Music festival, as a soloist of the Finnish Radio Symphony Orchestra together with Anu and Piia Komsi, and most recently as the soprano soloist of Lauri Porra's Basso work at the Helsinki Festival 2024.

Pasi Hyökki came up with the idea and acted as the primus motor in the Seasonal Concerts of the Choral Music that started in Helsinki in the fall of 2022. In the spring of 2023, he opened choralworks.fi, a new online distribution service specializing in PDF sheet music for choral works.

The St. Mary's Treblemakers is an extracurricular choral program that St. Mary High School offers. This is an auditioned female group and all of the Treblemakers are part of the larger SATB choir. The group performs on a regular basis for their school, community events, and at other major North American festivals. The choir has received annual invitations to MusicFest Canada (Nationals) where they consistently received GOLD awards and have attended many Worldstrides Festival of GOLD (invitation only elite choral festival). They accepted multiple offers in New York, San Francisco, and twice in Chicago, in L.A., Nashville, and other American destinations. The students work diligently and are dedicated to making the best music possible. For the past few years they have also received invitations

to sing at Carnegie Hall and had previously accepted an invitation to Cork Choral Festival which was subsequently cancelled due to covid.

Tanya Earle, the choir's artistic director, has a passion for the choral community, exploring complex repertoire and providing opportunities for her students that rises far beyond most high school programs. Tanya is in her 27th year of teaching an elite vocal/choral program that she solely developed from inception. She not only directs the extra curricular choir program but also teaches the vocal music classes. Her choral program draws students to the school each year from the surrounding area to gain this experience. It is her commitment and love of choral excellence, as well as the students' love for the program, that develops a community of singers who create exceptional music together. This choir has had the opportunity to sing with many of Canadian great artists including Marianas Trench, Juno award winner The Good Lovelies, Juno award winner Susan Aglukark, Aengus Finnan, and Rajaton, plus many other amazing artists. CHAMBER CHOIR OF THE COLLEGIUM MUSICUM BERLIN [GERMANY]



The Collegium Musicum Berlin is the musical home for over 400 members of the Free University and the Technical University of Berlin who, in addition to their studies or other employment, sing in the choir or play in one of the orchestras or the big band. Since 2019, she also teaches Conducting at the University of Arts in Berlin.

Donka is a sought-after clinician, adjudicator and workshop leader at many prestigious international events such as the World Choir Games, European Choir Games, Grand Prix of Nations and is also a member of the World Choir Council.

She has led the chamber choir to numerous concerts in Berlin and the surrounding area, on concert tours and to various competitions with great success. The choir received prizes in Olomouc (CZ) in 2016, at the Grand Prix in Berlin in 2017 and at the Berliner Chortreff. The choir represented the state of Berlin at the German Choir Competition 2018 and was named German Choir Master in Koblenz in 2022. In spring 2023, the ensemble was invited to the International Chamber Choir Competition in Marktoberdorf. One year later, in May 2024, the choir competed in two categories at the International Choral Competition of the Harmonie Festival in Limburg-Lindenholzhausen and was awarded first and second place, as well as gold certificates and a special prize.

Kammerkoret NOVA (NOVA Chamber Choir) is an ambitious amateur ensemble of around 30 singers based in Oslo, Norway. The choir is led by Julia Selina Blank. She worked from 1994 to 2000 as assistant director and pianist of the Children's Stage Choir of the Gran Teatro de La Habana in Cuba, from 1996 to 2000 as Professor of Choral Conducting at the National School of Arts of Cuba where she was also director of the Women's Choir, and she member of the Schola Cantorum Coralina, working as a teacher and pianist of the youth and children's choirs of this group directed by Alina Orraca.

She is currently a teacher at the Conservatorio Superior de Música "Massotti Littel" in Murcia and she has been the conductor of Coro Sinfonía since its foundation in 2002.

STOCKHOLMS MUSIK-GYMNASIUM YOUTH CHOIR [SWEDEN]



The different choirs of Stockholms Musikgymnasium (Upper Secondary School of Music) play a prominent part in the musical life of Stockholm, Sweden, and are involved in projects with production companies, "Rikskonserter" and the Swedish Radio. International contacts have resulted in concert tours to Italy, France, Germany, Poland, Hungary, Finland, Estonia, China and South Africa. Starting in 1959, the Stockholms Musikgymnasium was an integrated part of the music classes of the Adolf Fredrik School, but since 1984 it is now located in the beautifully renovated jugend style school of 1902 at Kungsholmen in Stockholm. The school offers

modified Natural and Social Science programmes that include advanced choral courses. Admission is highly competitive and accepts students based on a combination of grade point averages, singing auditions and tests in music theory.

This choir group started their education in August 2022 and consists of one Social Science class. They have choral singing together four times a week and graduate in June 2025. Ms. Maria Goundorina, Ms. Helene Stureborg and Mr. Bengt Ollén have been their vocal coaches and conductors, and they have performed in several concerts together during their years at the Stockholms Musikgymnasium. This choir group was invited by the Swedish Embassies in both Finland and Lithuania celebrating Swedish events abroad. On their repertoire they have several works a cappella by both old and contemporary composers.

Maria Goundorina started to teach choral singing at the Stockholms Musikgymnasium in 2023.

URDAIBAI KANTAGUNEA [BASQUE COUNTRY - SPAIN]



In the Basque Country, there is a tradition of singing that is deeply rooted in the Basque people. There are more than 200 traditional choral groups in a country of only 2.5 million people. As there has always been a strong custom of singing at meals, dinners, and gatherings of friends, a new movement of Basque folk and popular singing groups emerged about 25 years ago.

This movement is characterised by singing in the streets and squares, encouraging anyone to join in. When these groups sing in public, people who are not part of the group often feel inspired to join us and sing along. A distinctive feature of these groups is that they are often accompanied by a small ensemble of musicians playing different instruments.

Urdaibai Kantagunea is one of the pioneering groups of this new style. In 2025, they will celebrate their 20th anniversary. During that time Urdaibai Kantagunea has performed an average of 15 to 20 times per year. In addition to singing in many towns across the Basque Country, they have also performed internationally in Hannover and Stockholm, collaborating with friendly choirs from those cities.

Zarautz Abesbatza was created in 1983 under the direction of Joakin Iruretagoiena. In 1996, Jaione Eskudero was appointed as conductor. Over the years, the choir has given numerous concerts in the Basque Country and abroad, in various provinces of Spain, Catalonia, Germany, Israel, Italy, Switzerland, Argentina, the Czech Republic, Portugal, Belgium and France.

The choir has premiered and made known the works and biographies of composers and personalities of the town, such as Francisco Escudero, Angel Illarramendi, Imanol Urbieta, Antxon Sarasua, Mertxe Isasti, Angel Urcelay, J.J. N. Garmendia, the Bersolari Iñaki Eizmendi "Basarri", the poet and writer Salbatore Mitxelena and Xabier Agirre "Lizardi" among others, organising exceptional tribute concerts.

Zarautz Abesbatza organises and promotes interaction with other cultural groups from the town and from other towns and countries, with the Basque Country Orchestra, the Orchestra of the Donostia Conservatory, the Et Incarnatus string orchestra, Oreka TX, the

Laguntza txistularis group, the Orfeón Donostiarra, the Belgian vocal group Contretemps, with many other choirs from Gipuzkoa and the provinces and with well-known singer-songwriters.

In September 2017, Zarautz Abesbatza premiered Anjel Illarramendi's 7th Symphony together with the Orfeón Donostiarra and the Orquesta de Euskadi in a monographic concert, a tribute to the composer. In 2018, Karonte published the CD of this concert.

In 2021 it organised a monographic concert in the Lizardi auditorium in Zarautz with poems by Xabier Lizardi on his 125th birthday, together with Antton Valverde, a well-known singersongwriter, and his group. In 2022, on the occasion of the 20th anniversary of the death of Francisco Escudero, the choir held special events in several parishes in various provinces. In 2023, on the occasion of the 40th anniversary of the choir, they organised a trip to France, performing in three venues in Bordeaux and special concerts, together with the Zarautz Music Band, in the pavilion of the same town.
